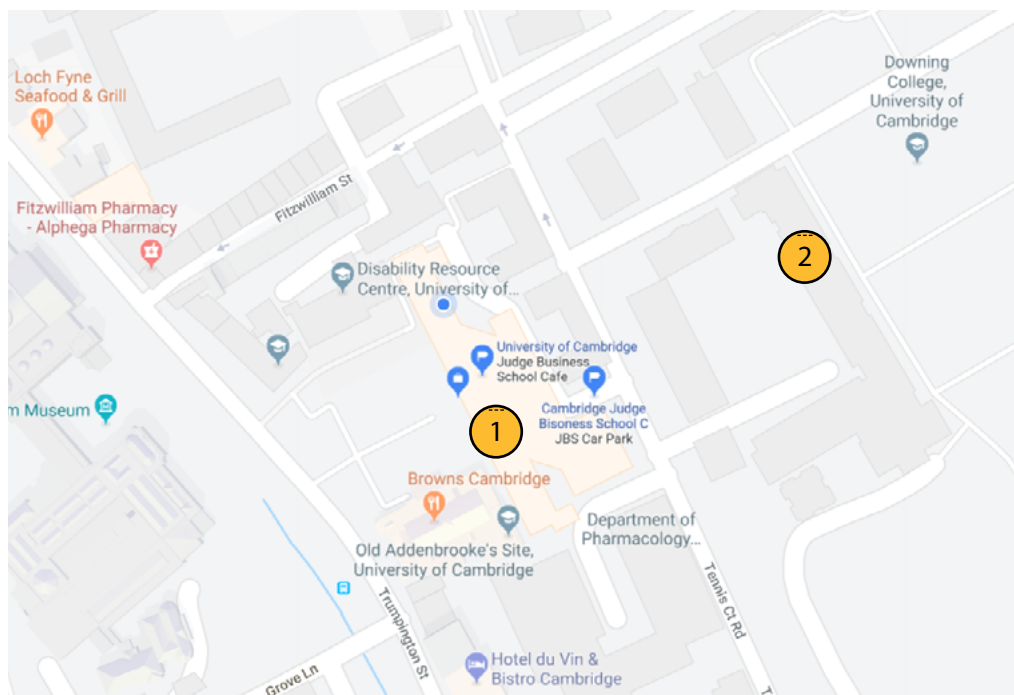

Directions to the School**By rail**

Cambridge is around 50 minutes by train from London King's Cross station using the non-stop 'Cambridge Express' service (which runs twice an hour). Trains from London Liverpool Street station take slightly longer. The Eurostar service from Paris takes just over two hours and arrives into central London at St Pancras International station, which is just across the road from King's Cross and the direct train service to Cambridge.

Cambridge Judge Business School is a ten-minute taxi ride from the rail station and taxis can be found outside the station entrance.

There is an hourly direct train from Stansted Airport to Cambridge which takes around 35 minutes.

Regular National Express coach services link Cambridge to London, Stansted, Heathrow and Gatwick.
