The organizers will pay for up to four nights' accommodation for participants who have requested funding. For those who are funding their own travel and accommodation, please pay your hotel bill on departure. Additional nights will only be covered for participants who have requested and received written authorization from CEPR. Incidental expenses such as the mini bar, telephone or any other service offered by the hotel, however, will not be covered and should be paid on departure by each participant.

The cost of a single room, per night is NOK 895 (inclusive of breakfast).

Airport to Hotels

The nearest airport is **Flesland Airport**, which is situated 20 kilometres south of Bergen. Upon arrival at the airport, participants are advised to take a bus to the centre of Bergen. There is a frequent bus service, departing every 20 minutes from

outside the Arrivals hall. The last stop is at the hotel Radisson SAS Royal Hotel – you should depart here for both hotels. The cost of a single ticket is NOK 60, with an approximate journey time of 45 minutes.

Alternatively, participants can take a taxi to the hotel. Taxis are also located outside the Arrivals hall.

Please note however, that CEPR does not reimburse taxi fares.

The nearest train station is **Bergen Train Station**. From here you should go to **Kaigaten** which is 4 minutes from the Bergen Train Station (see the attached map) where you can catch one of several buses (No. 20, 21, 23, 24, 80, 90) and you should get off either at Radisson SAS Royal Hotel or at Bryggen Orion Hotel.

Hotel to Conference Venue

To reach the conference venue from the hotel you could take any of the yellow and red buses (No. 20, 21, 23, 24, 50, 70, 71, 80, 90). The bus departs from Radisson SAS Royal Hotel and Bryggen Orion Hotel. You should get off at NHH (The Norwegian School of Economics and Business Administration). This will cost NOK 20 and take approx 15 minutes.

Meals

Lunch and refreshments will be provided each day of the conference. Breakfast should be taken at the hotel.

Further details regarding dinner arrangements will be given on the day/s.

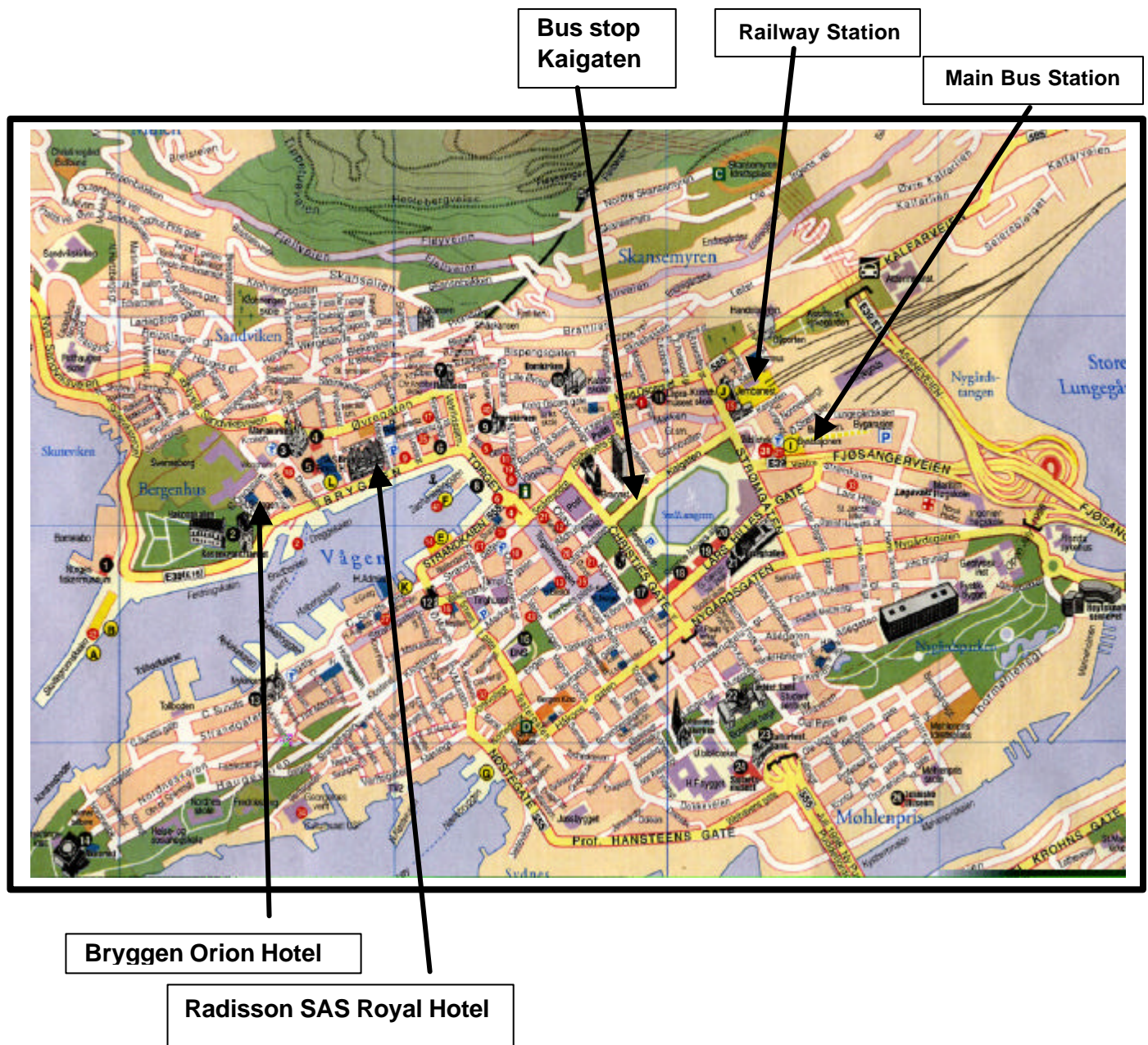

About Bergen

Bergen is a city of about 225,000 inhabitants, situated on the mountainous western coast of Norway. A striking feature to many newcomers is the city's abundance of green parks, tree-lined streets and lakes and its spectacular setting between the mountains and the sea.

The city of Bergen has a long history in shipping and fishing.

Bryggens Museum

Dreggsallmemmingen 3, N-5835 Bergen

Daily: 10.00 – 17.00

Bryggen is the old hanseatic part of Bergen, and Bergen was once one of the more important hanseatic cities outside Germany.

This museum is based on the findings of archaeological excavations of Bryggen between 1955 and 1972. The foundations of the oldest buildings in Bergen (from the 12th century) are on display. Unearthed ceramics and artefacts illustrate commerce, shipping, cultural activities, handicrafts and daily life in the Middle Ages.

Old Bergen Museum (Gamle Bergen)

Daily: 09.30 – 16.30

This open-air museum with more than 40 wooden houses, is representative of 18th and 19th century Bergen architecture. The period interiors of the houses present an idea of town life as it was then. Guided tours are available every hour, starting at 10.00 – 16.00.

Bergen Art Museum

Tuesday – Sunday: 10.00 – 17.00

The art museum includes The City Art Collection, Stenersens Collection and Rasmus Meyers Collection. In the City Art Collection, notable 19th and 20th century Norwegian and international paintings are featured. The museum also exhibits interiors from old Bergen homes.

Mount Floien

Vetrlidsallmenningen 21, N5014 Bergen (Funicular Station is 150m from Bergen Fish Market)

Departures on the hour and every half-hour from early morning until midnight.

A trip on the famous Funicular will take you to one of the best views of the city. It will take you from the city centre to the top of Mount Floien. Numerous paths offer easy walks through beautiful woodland terrain with lakes and mountains. During the summer the restaurant on Mount Floien is open daily.

Bergen Maritime Museum

Sunday – Friday: 11.00 – 14.00

Bergen Maritime Museum illustrates the history of seafaring, its development and importance to Bergen and Norway, past and present. The museum also houses a spectacular exhibition of Viking ship models.
